the time of the recording of the certificate in the registry of deeds as herein provided, in all cases such officers shall file with the town treasurer a true copy of said certificate and also at the time of recording as aforesaid, the said officer shall mail by registered letter to each record holder of a mortgage on said real estate, addressed to him at his place of last and usual abode, a true copy of said certificate. If the real estate has not been assessed to its record owner the officer shall send by registered mail a like notice to the record owner. The fee costs to be charged to the taxpayer for said notice and filing shall not exceed \$1 and the fee costs to be charged by the register of deeds for such filing shall not exceed 50c.'

Chapter 348

AN ACT Relating to the Board of Trustees of the Jointly-Contributory Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. L., 1933, c. 1, § 227-K, sub-§ 1, amended. Subsection 1 of section 227-K of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933, as enacted by chapter 328 of the public laws of 1941, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'(1) The general administration and responsibility for the proper operation of the retirement system and for making effective the provisions of this act are hereby vested in a board of 3 trustees. ~~The board shall consist of the state controller, ex officio, and 2 trustees who shall be appointed by the governor, subject to the approval of the council, for terms of 4 years; provided, however, that of the first 2 appointed trustees one shall be appointed for a term of 2 years. If a vacancy occurs in the office of a trustee, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the office was previously filled~~ The board shall consist of the chairman of the state personnel board, the state treasurer, and the state controller, ex officio; their terms of office as such board members to run concurrently with their terms in said state positions.'

Sec. 2. P. L., 1933, c. 1, § 227-E, sub-§ 2, amended. Subsection 2 of section 227-E of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933, as enacted by chapter 328 of the public laws of 1941, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new paragraph to be lettered (e) and to read as follows:

'(e) The deputy warden, the captain of the guard and any guard of the state prison who is a member of this system and who has creditable service of at least 25 years may be retired at $\frac{1}{2}$ of his average final compensation

provided such retirement is requested either by the member or the commissioner of institutional service. If any such member should become eligible under the provisions of this system, as a result of prior service and membership service, to a retirement allowance in excess of $\frac{1}{2}$ of his average final compensation he shall be entitled to the higher retirement allowance.'

Chapter 349

AN ACT Relating to Salary of Adjutant-General.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 125, § 25, amended. Section 25 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 25. The adjutant-general. The adjutant-general shall receive an annual salary of ~~four thousand dollars~~ \$4,500; he shall receive no other fee, emolument, or perquisite.'

Chapter 350

AN ACT Relating to the Manufacture and Sale of Apple Wine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Sale of apple wine, regulated. The Maine state liquor commission is authorized and empowered to issue licenses under this act for the manufacture of apple wine from apples grown in Maine. The annual fee for such license shall be \$100, and such license shall expire on August 31st of the year next ensuing.

Sec. 2. Records. The licensee or operator of an apple-winery under the provisions of this act shall keep an accurate record in detail showing the date and number of bushels by weight of apples received at such apple-winery, the number of gallons of apple wine manufactured therefrom, the name of the owner, and the place in the state where such apples were grown, together with such other information as may be required by the commission, and process the same in conformity with the regulations of the commission.
