Chapter 19

AN ACT to Authorize Stacyville Plantation to Withdraw from the Maine Forestry District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Stacyville Plantation may withdraw from the Maine forestry district. Stacyville Plantation, in the county of Penobscot, may by vote at any meeting of its inhabitants, duly called and held, withdraw from the Maine forestry district. A copy of such vote certified by the town clerk shall be forwarded forthwith to the treasurer of state and the forest commissioner and from the time such certified copy is filed in the office of the treasurer of state, said plantation shall cease to be a part of said forestry district.

Chapter 20

AN ACT Providing for Transfer of Property to State of Maine by the Maine Maritime Academy on Dissolution.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1941, c. 37, additional. Chapter 37 of the private and special laws of 1941, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered section 7, and to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 7. Transfer of property on dissolution. Whenever the Maine Maritime Academy is dissolved, its real and personal estate shall vest in the state of Maine.'
