**Chapter 23****AN ACT Relating to the Examination of the Public Debt Amortization Fund of the City of Waterville.**

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

P. & S. L., 1927, c. 67, § 9, amended. Section 9 of chapter 67 of the private and special laws of 1927 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 9. Jurisdiction of state auditor. The state ~~bank commissioner~~ auditor is hereby empowered and directed to examine, invoice, check up and audit the said public debt amortization fund at least once each year and report the condition of said fund to the city council.'

**Chapter 24****AN ACT Extending the Period for which the Board of Finance in the City of Waterville is Established.**

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Board of finance of city of Waterville, continued. The board of finance of the city of Waterville, established by chapter 48 of the private and special laws of 1933 is hereby continued for an additional period of 6 years; and all provisions of said act except section 9 thereof and except that relating to the period for which said board was originally established, shall remain in force for such additional period of 6 years.
