special plantation meeting legally called and held before November 1st, 1943, an appropriate article being inserted in the call for such meeting. If a majority of the qualified voters of the plantation present and voting, vote in favor of the acceptance of this act, it shall become operative on March 31, 1944. The town clerk shall forthwith file with the secretary of state a certificate of the action of the plantation thereon.

#### Chapter 55

AN ACT Relating to the Bath Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1937, c. 64, additional. Chapter 64 of the private and special laws of 1937 is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 18-A, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 18-A. Absence of recorder or vacancy in office. Whenever said recorder shall be absent for any reason or whenever the office of recorder is vacant, the judge may exercise the same powers and perform the same duties as said recorder is authorized to perform.'

#### Chapter 56

AN ACT to Provide a Town Manager Form of Government for the Town of Brunswick.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. The municipal year; date of town meetings. The municipal year of the town of Brunswick shall be February 1 to January 31. The annual town meeting shall be held in the town of Brunswick in the county of Cumberland, on the 1st Monday of March in each year, and the voters shall then choose by ballot, as now provided by law, a moderator.
- Sec. 2. Election of officers. At the annual town meeting, the voters shall elect by ballot as hereinafter provided a town council consisting of 7 persons who are qualified to vote in said town to be known as councillors, and a member or members of the superintending school committee, in accordance with the revised statutes of 1930 and amendments thereto, a town clerk, a town treasurer and a tax collector.
