Chapter 2

RESOLVE, Approving the Reconveyance of Certain Land to the City of Saco.

Reconveyance of certain land to city of Saco, validated. Resolved: That the deed executed by Raymond E. Rendall, forest commissioner of the state, under and by virtue of an order passed by the council and approved by the governor, on May 21, 1941, reconveying in the name of the state of Maine to the city of Saco May 26, 1941, land described in a deed of the city of Saco to the state of Maine, dated November 25, 1940, recorded in York county registry of deeds, book 951, page 406, is hereby declared legal and valid and the action of Raymond E. Rendall, forest commissioner, in the execution of the same is hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.

Chapter 3

RESOLVE, Relating to Taking of White Perch in Chesuncook Lake.

Fishing for white perch in Chesuncook lake; regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation permitting fishing for white perch in Chesuncook lake from the time the ice goes out in the spring until September 30, inclusive, the bag limit and size of fish to conform to the general law.

Chapter 4

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Cambridge Pond.

Fishing in Cambridge pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Cambridge pond in Cambridge, county of Somerset, to ice fishing from the time the ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring for pickerel, hornpouts, white perch, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs and smelts.
