Chapter 7

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Maine Defense Commission to Convey Certain Land in Presque Isle.

Maine Defense Commission authorized to convey certain land. Resolved: That the Maine Defense Commission be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to convey by quitclaim deed to the city of Presque Isle, the interest of the state in a certain piece or parcel of land on the northerly side of Mechanic street in the city of Presque Isle and being a part of the premises known as the Northern Maine Fair Grounds, bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at a steel pin driven in the ground on the south line of the property of the grantor at a point three hundred fifty-five and seven-tenths (355.7) feet westerly along the south line of said premises from the point of its intersection with the continuation of the dividing line between the Mary Phinney lot and the Guy Hussey lot, so called, which lots are situated on the southerly side of said Mechanic street; thence northerly at right angles to the south line of said grantor's land two hundred and seventy-five (275) feet to a steel pin; thence westerly at right angles four hundred and fifty (450) feet to a steel pin; thence southerly at right angles, to the northerly line of the land known as the Tressie A. LaPlante lot; thence easterly along the line of the land of the grantor and said Tressie A. LaPlante lot to the northeast corner of said LaPlante lot; thence southerly along the line of the land belonging to the said grantor and the said LaPlante lot one hundred forty-five and eight-tenths (145.8) feet to the line of Mechanic street; thence easterly along the north line of Mechanic street to the place of beginning.

Chapter 8

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Round Pond.

Fishing in Round pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Round pond in Lyman and Sand pond in Limington in the county of York, to ice fishing.
