CHAP, 26

this being the amount paid in 1878 to satisfy a court decision in favor of Joseph Granger, the said amount having been charged out of said trust fund, and be it further

Resolved: That the sum of \$1,163.89 be transferred from the sinking fund reserve of the state of Maine to the Indian Township administration fund, this representing the total of balances which accrued in 1938-39 and 1939-40 after deductions of amounts expended on artesian well account and which were never transferred to the Indian fund.

Chapter 25

RESOLVE, Relating to Dredging Quahaugs in Maquoit Bay.

Dredging quahaugs in Maquoit bay; regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation making it unlawful to dredge, or to take quahaugs by any means, except by the usual manner of hand digging with a so called clam hoe, or by picking quahaugs out of the mud by hand, from the waters or flats of Maquoit bay, namely: all of the territory north and northeast of a line drawn from the most southerly end of Mere point in the town of Brunswick to the northeasterly end of Little Flying Point in the town of Freeport.

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200, or by imprisonment for 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Chapter 26

RESOLVE, for the Laying of the County Taxes for the Year Nineteen Hundred Forty-three.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the several counties hereinafter named, have certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due, and

Whereas, the several counties have no source of revenue except the taxes hereinafter mentioned, and

Whereas, it is necessary that the taxes hereinafter mentioned be immediately assessed, in order to provide the required revenue for the several counties, and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of article 31 of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

County taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the sum appearing opposite to the names of the counties in the following schedule is hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied to the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same and for other purposes of law, for the year 1943.
