CHAP. 57

Chapter 55

RESOLVE, Relating to Retirement Pension for Ralph M. Chesley, of Thomaston.

Retirement pension for Ralph M. Chesley. Resolved: That Ralph M. Chesley, of Thomaston, overseer in the upholstery shop at the Maine State Prison, is hereby made eligible to receive a retirement pension under the provisions of section 227-C of chapter 328 of the public laws passed at the special session of the legislature in January, 1942.

Chapter 56

RESOLVE, Placing Sherman Graves of Mexico under Law Relating to Superintendents' Retirement Plan.

Sherman Graves placed under law relating to superintendents' retirement plan. Resolved: That Sherman Graves, of Mexico, shall be entitled to credit for 24½ years' service as a superintendent of schools under the state employees' retirement system for superintendents in service prior to July I, 1924.

Chapter 57

RESOLVE, in Favor of Miss Mary A. Hughes, of Frenchville.

Mary A. Hughes; state pension. Resolved: That a pension be, and hereby is, granted to Miss Mary A. Hughes, of Frenchville, to be paid quarterly from the appropriation for teachers' pensions. Said pension shall begin 90 days after the adjournment of the legislature, and shall continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.
