Chapter 146

AN ACT Relative to Game Preserve in York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 90, 19th ¶, continued. The provisions of the 19th paragraph of section 90 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, which relate to Limington, Hollis and Waterboro game preserve, are hereby continued until July 1, 1947.

Chapter 147

AN ACT Relating to Licenses for the Sale of Malt Beverages.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1943, c. 315, repealed. Chapter 315 of the public laws of 1943 is hereby repealed.

AN ACT Relating to Marking of Sheep.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 27, § 122, repealed. Section 122 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.
