AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the County Attorney of Knox County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 130, amended. That part of section 130 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to Knox is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Knox, \$1,000 \$1,200,'

AN ACT Relating to Transfer of Liquor Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 35, amended. Section 35 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 35. Transfer of licenses. The commission, upon application in writing, may transfer the spirituous and vinous liquor license of any hotel or club, or the vinous liquor license of any restaurant, or the malt liquor license of any hotel, club, restaurant, or retail licensee from one place to another within the same municipality, as the commission may determine but such transfer of the spirituous and vinous liquor license of any hotel or club, or the vinous liquor license of any restaurant, or the malt liquor license of any hotel or club, or the vinous liquor license of any restaurant, or the malt liquor license of any hotel or club, or the vinous liquor license of any restaurant, or the malt liquor license of any hotel, club or restaurant shall only be made with the approval of the municipal officers thereof; but no transfer shall be made to premises for which the license could not have been originally lawfully issued.
