#### Chapter 229

AN ACT Increasing the Salaries of the County Attorney and Assistant County Attorney of Androscoggin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 130, amended. That part of section 130 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to the salaries of the county attorney and assistant county attorney of Androscoggin county is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Androscoggin, \$1,800 \$2,400; assistant county attorney, \$1,000 \$1,500,'

#### Chapter 230

AN ACT Relating to State Normal School and Teachers' College Board.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 189, amended. Section 189 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 189. State normal school and teachers' college board, appointment, powers, and duties. The state normal schools shall be under the direction of a board, to be known as the "state normal schools school and teachers' college board," to be composed of 5 members, 4 of whom shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the council, for terms of 4 years, and not more than 2 of the 4 appointed members shall be of the same political party. The commissioner shall be, by virtue of his office, a member of the said board. Said board shall have charge of the general interests of said schools; shall see that the affairs
