CHAP. 372

'Sec. 42-D. Limitation. No money from this fund shall be expended on any road which is a part of the federal aid, state, state aid or 3rd class roads, as it is intended to apply only to the unimproved roads of the state. Any balance unexpended by the towns at the end of any fiscal year shall remain to their credit for use in any other fiscal year to carry out the purposes of sections 42-A to 42-E, inclusive.'

'Sec. 42-E. Purpose. It shall be the intent and purpose of sections 42-A to 42-E, inclusive, to set up a fund and a method for more equal distribution of money for unimproved roads than can be had by the present blanket road resolve, so called.'

Sec. 2. Limitations. It is the intent of the legislature that the provisions of this act shall be in addition to any blanket road resolve, so called, passed by either the 91st or 92nd legislature and the money appropriated by such blanket road resolves shall be expended only for the purposes designated in such blanket road resolves.

Chapter 372

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Forest Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 32, § 1, amended. The last sentence of section 1 of chapter 32 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The commissioner shall receive an annual salary of ~~\$5,000~~ \$6,000, of which amount \$3,000 shall be paid from funds raised and created by the tax assessed under the provisions of section 74.'
