Chapter 373

AN ACT Relating to Salaries and Expenses of Members of the State Liquor Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 5, amended. Section 5 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 5. Salaries and expenses of members. The salary of the chairman of the commission shall be ~~\$4,000~~ \$6,000 per year and the salary of each of the other members shall be ~~\$3,000~~ \$4,000 per year, and in addition each member shall be allowed his reasonable expense incurred in the performance of his duties; provided, however, that such expense shall not include travel between his place of residence and the commission office, or board and lodging in the city or town where such office is located.'

Chapter 374

AN ACT to Revise the Laws Relating to Inland Fisheries and Game.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Repealing clause. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes of 1930, which became chapter 33 of the revised statutes of 1944; and section 23 of chapter 125 and sections 3 and 4 of chapter 129 of the revised statutes of 1930; and the public laws passed during the years 1931-1943, inclusive, which relate to and affect the department of inland fisheries and game, its laws, rules and regulations and which were exempted in "An Act to Repeal the Acts Consolidated in the Revised Statutes of the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Four", passed by the 91st legislature in special session on September 20, 1944, are hereby repealed. Section 37 of chapter 11 of the revised statutes of 1930 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. Enacting clause. The following provisions are hereby enacted in place of the provisions of law repealed by the preceding section and shall be cited as chapter 33 of the revised statutes:
