Chapter 9

AN ACT Transferring the Rights, Duties and Obligations of the Livermore Falls Sewer District to the Inhabitants of Livermore Falls and Abolishing the Livermore Falls Sewer District as a Separate Municipal Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Transfer of rights, etc. The rights, powers, duties and functions of the Livermore Falls Sewer District, as created by chapter 289 of the private and special laws of 1907 and amendments thereto, are hereby conferred upon the inhabitants of the town of Livermore Falls, who, through their duly elected municipal officers, shall administer, carry on and perform the rights, duties and obligations heretofore exercised and performed by the aforesaid Livermore Falls Sewer District; and all the property, real or personal, of said Livermore Falls Sewer District shall be transferred by the trustees thereof to the said inhabitants of the town of Livermore Falls upon the acceptance by them of the benefits of this act and said inhabitants shall be charged with, and shall be liable for, the performance of all the contracts, duties and existing obligations of said sewer district.

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1907, c. 289, repealed. Chapter 289 of the private and special laws of 1907, as amended, relating to the Livermore Falls Sewer District, is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. Effective date; referendum. This act shall be submitted for approval to the voters of the town of Livermore Falls at the regular annual town meeting to be held on the 1st Monday of March, 1946, called by a warrant containing an article for that purpose, and this act shall not become effective, except for the purpose of such referendum, unless approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting thereon. The town clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this act to the following question and cause the same to be printed on the official ballot, "Shall an act passed by the Legislature in the year 1945 entitled, 'An Act Transferring the Rights, Duties and Obligations of the Livermore Falls Sewer District to the Inhabitants of Livermore Falls and Abolishing the Livermore Falls Sewer District as a Separate Municipal Corporation', be accepted?" Otherwise, said ballot shall be in the form provided by law when a constitutional amendment is submitted to the vote of the people. The result of the vote shall be declared by the municipal officers and a certificate thereof filed by the town clerk with the secretary of state.
