**CHAP. 17** 

the death or resignation of any member, the body hereinbefore authorized to appoint such member shall appoint another member for the remainder of the unexpired term. The members of the board shall receive such compensation as the city council may determine but each member shall receive the same compensation.'

#### Chapter 16

AN ACT Relating to Compensation of Members of the Board of Aldermen of the City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. V, § 9, amended. Section 9 of Article V of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 9. Compensation. The members of the board of aldermen shall receive as full compensation for the performance of their official duties as aldermen the sum of \$10 for each meeting of the city council which they shall attend provided that no alderman shall be paid an amount in excess of \$200 \$300 for such attendance during at any one term. Members of the board of aldermen when they shall convene for the purpose of constituting a board of examiners shall receive as full compensation for such duties the sum of \$3 for each meeting attended.'

### Chapter 17

AN ACT Relating to Nomination Papers in the City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. III, § 2, amended. Section 2 of Article III of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 2. Nomination papers. The signatures to nomination papers need not all be affixed to I petition but to each separate petition there shall be

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attached the affidavit of the circulator thereof stating the number of signers on such petition and that each signature appended thereto was made in his presence and is the genuine signature of the person whose name it purports to be. With each signature shall be stated the place of residence of the signer giving the street and number of the street or other description sufficient to identify the same. Provided, however, that no such nomination papers shall be issued by the city clerk or circularized for signature more than 30 days prior to the earliest date allowed for filing such papers. The form of nomination petition shall be substantially as follows:
