Chapter 20

AN ACT to Dissolve The Portland and Ogdensburg Railway.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The Portland and Ogdensburg Railway dissolved. The sale and conveyance of the property and franchises of The Portland and Ogdensburg Railway to Maine Central Railroad Company, and the assumption by Maine Central Railroad Company of the bonded indebtedness, the mortgage securing the same, and other indebtedness of The Portland and Ogdensburg Railway, are approved, confirmed and declared to be valid and said The Portland and Ogdensburg Railway is hereby dissolved. All claims and rights of mortgagees or other creditors of The Portland and Ogdensburg Railway may hereafter be enforced against the Maine Central Railroad Company in the same manner and with like effect as they might otherwise have been enforced against The Portland and Ogdensburg Railway, and all existing claims, rights, demands and choses in action of The Portland and Ogdensburg Railway may be presented and enforced by, and for the benefit of, the Maine Central Railroad Company in the same manner and with like effect as the same might otherwise be prosecuted and enforced by The Portland and Ogdensburg Railway.

Chapter 21

AN ACT to Make Valid the Acts and Doings of River-side Cemetery Association of Cape Elizabeth and to Authorize the Transfer by that Association and the Acceptance by the Inhabitants of the Town of Cape Elizabeth of that Association's Cemetery and Trust Funds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Ratification. All corporate acts, doings and proceedings of River-side Cemetery Association of Cape Elizabeth, all gifts, grants, bequests, donations and conveyances made to it and its trustees, and all grants and conveyances made by it and its trustees are hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.

Sec. 2. Authority for River-side Cemetery Association of Cape Elizabeth to transfer its cemetery and trust funds to the Inhabitants of the Town

of Cape Elizabeth. River-side Cemetery Association of Cape Elizabeth and the trustees thereof are hereby authorized and empowered to give, grant, convey, transfer, assign and set over to the inhabitants of the Town of Cape Elizabeth, a body corporate, its successors and assigns, the cemetery and all lands and their appurtenances near the Spurwink church in Cape Elizabeth and all other grounds owned by said association and trustees by appropriate deed of the fee thereof, subject to such rights of occupation and burial as have heretofore been granted by said association, and also all trust funds held by said association and trustees.

Sec. 3. Inhabitants of the Town of Cape Elizabeth authorized to accept and hold cemetery and trust funds. The inhabitants of the town of Cape Elizabeth are hereby authorized and empowered to accept the cemetery, lands and their appurtenances near Spurwink Church in Cape Elizabeth and all other grounds owned by the River-side Cemetery Association of Cape Elizabeth and the trustees thereof, and also all trust funds held by said association and trustees, and to hold, conduct, manage, maintain and administer said property and trust funds according to the laws of the state of Maine in such cases made and provided.

Sec. 4. Transfer of general funds. After such transfer and after settlement of its liabilities and accounts, River-side Cemetery Association of Cape Elizabeth may deliver over to the inhabitants of the town of Cape Elizabeth such amounts as may remain of its general funds, the same to be accepted and used by the inhabitants of the town of Cape Elizabeth as part of the general funds available for maintenance and upkeep of the cemetery.

Chapter 22

AN ACT Relating to the Rules and Regulations of Nasson College.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
