Chapter 26

AN ACT Amending the Charter of the City of Bangor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1931, c. 54, Article II, § 1, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 1 of Article II of chapter 54 of the private and special laws of 1931 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The ~~members of the~~ city council shall be and constitute the municipal officers of the city of Bangor for all purposes required by statute, and, except as otherwise herein specifically provided, shall have all powers and authority given to and perform all duties required of municipal officers, and mayors of cities under the laws of this state.'

Chapter 27

AN ACT Relating to the Fire Department of the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1921, c. 134, repealed. Chapter 134 of the private and special laws of 1921 is hereby repealed.

Chapter 28

AN ACT Amending the Charter of the Preachers' Aid Society of the Maine Conference of the Methodist Church.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1923, c. 26, § 3, amended. Section 3 of chapter 26 of the private and special laws of 1923 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 3. Powers and privileges. Said corporation shall be capable of having, holding and taking in fee simple, by gift, grant, devise or other-
