Chapter 40

AN ACT Relating to the Fire and Police Commission for the Town of Skowhegan.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1909, c. 247, repealed. Chapter 247 of the private and special laws of 1909 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. **Certain powers to revert in town.** The authority of the town of Skowhegan to delegate all its powers and that of its municipal officers relating to the inspection of buildings, a fire department, the prevention and extinguishment of fires, and its police officers and department is hereby terminated, and henceforth such powers shall revert in the town of Skowhegan and its municipal officers under the general laws of the state.

Sec. 3. **Referendum.** This act shall take effect and be in full force when the same shall have been accepted by the inhabitants of said town, qualified to vote in town affairs, at a legal meeting under a warrant containing an article giving notice thereof, provided it shall be accepted within 1 year from the date of approval.

Chapter 41

AN ACT Enabling Board of Managers of the Jefferson Cary Hospital Fund to Accept Gifts or Legacies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1913, c. 20, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 20 of the private and special laws of 1913, as amended by chapter 95 of the private and special laws of 1915, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Such board of managers of the Jefferson Cary Hospital Fund is hereby empowered to accept and receive in behalf of the town of Caribou any gift or legacy made subsequent to March 17, 1915 by any person or persons or body corporate to the Cary Memorial Hospital or to the town of Caribou for the benefit of said hospital, and to manage the same upon the trusts and according to the conditions provided by the donor thereof.'

Chapter 42

AN ACT Amending the Charter of the Brunswick and Topsham Water District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1903, c. 158, § 5, amended. The last sentence of section 5 of chapter 158 of the private and special laws of 1903, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Each member shall receive in full compensation for his services an allowance of ~~one hundred dollars~~ \$300 per annum, beginning January 1, 1945.'

Chapter 43.

AN ACT to Repeal the Pension Law for Police in the Town of Houlton.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1937, c. 63, repealed. Chapter 63 of the private and special laws of 1937 is hereby repealed.
