Private and Special Laws

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE

As Passed by the Ninety-second Legislature

1945

Immediately upon the election and qualification of the new committee thus elected, as herein provided, the term of office of committeemen existing prior to this election in said town shall cease.'

'Sec. 5-B. Members to be sworn; subcommittees; rules and regulations. Before entering upon the duties of this office the members of said committee shall be duly sworn. This committee may appoint subcommittees and make such rules and regulations for the government of the board, and to facilitate its work, as may be deemed best. A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; but in case of vacancies a majority of the members remaining in office may transact such business as may be necessary until such vacancy or vacancies have been filled, as provided by law. Said committee shall exercise all the powers and perform all the duties which are conferred and imposed upon the superintending school committee by the laws of this state. Said committee shall receive no compensation for its services except by vote of said town.'

'Sec. 5-C. Committee to have full representation in election of superintendent of schools. Said committee shall have a representation of 3 members on the joint board of which it is a part in the election of the superintendent of schools, apportioning the time he is to serve each town and fixing his compensation.'

Chapter 69

AN ACT Relating to Acquiring of Wharf by City of Rockland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

City council authorized to acquire wharf. The city council of the city of Rockland is hereby authorized to acquire, operate and maintain for the inhabitants of the city of Rockland, by purchase, lease or otherwise, a wharf and dock suitable for a municipal pier.
