Chapter 79

AN ACT Increasing the Salary of the Judge of the Rockland Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1903, c. 114, § 13, amended. Section 13 of chapter 114 of the private and special laws of 1903, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 13. Salary of judge, etc. Said city of Rockland shall have power and it shall be its duty to raise money to provide suitable room or rooms in which to hold said court, and to furnish same in an appropriate manner, including stationery, record books, fuel, lights and other things necessary to accommodate said court. The judge of said court shall receive from the county of Knox, in quarter-yearly payments, at the close of each quarter, an annual salary of \$1,400 \$1,600, which shall be in full for all fees pertaining to said office, and the judge or recorder of said court shall not act as counsel or attorney in any case within the exclusive jurisdiction of said court, nor in such matter or thing which may depend on or have relation to any case, matter or thing which has been or is pending in said court.'

Chapter 80

AN ACT Relating to Salary of Recorder of Rockland Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1903, c. 114, § 14, amended. Section 14 of chapter 114 of the private and special laws of 1903, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 14. Recorder; salary, appointment, etc. The governor, by and with the consent of the council, shall appoint a recorder of said court, who shall be a resident of Knox county and an attorney-at-law, who shall qualify in the manner provided by law, and who shall give bond to the county of Knox in the sum of \$600 to be approved by the county commissioners of said county. Said recorder shall be appointed for the term of

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4 years and shall receive a salary of \$1,200 per year to be paid quarterly from the treasury of said county of Knox. The recorder may administer oaths. He shall keep the records of said court. The signature of the recorder, as such shall be sufficient evidence of his right to act instead of the judge in accordance with the provisions of this act or with the provisions relating to trial justices not conflicting with this act.'

Chapter 81

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Judge of the Franklin Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1943, c. 75, § 2, amended. The 1st paragraph of that part of section 2, designated "Sec. 2", of chapter 75 of the private and special laws of 1943 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The judge of the Franklin municipal court shall receive an annual salary of \$200 \$1,000 and such additional sum, not exceeding \$400, as the county commissioners may approve for necessary traveling expenses, payable on the 1st day of each month from the treasury of the county of Franklin. All expenses of said court, including blank books of record, dockets and blanks necessary for the use of said court, shall be paid from the treasury of said county of Franklin on vouchers approved by the county commissioners of said county.'

Chapter 82

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Judge of Western Somerset Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
