department, shall be retired upon his petition; whereupon he shall be entitled to a pension equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ of the pay which he received at the time the disability occurred or at the time his application was filed with the commission petitioning for retirement benefits. Nothing herein shall be construed to deprive the incumbent chief of the years of service presently accrued as chief of said department.'

Chapter 94

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Recorder of the Brunswick Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1903, c. 277, § 8, amended. The 4th sentence of section 8 of chapter 277 of the private and special laws of 1903, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'For all services performed the said recorder shall receive from the county of Cumberland an annual salary of ~~\$300~~ \$600 to be paid him in quarterly payments.'

Chapter 95

AN ACT to Increase the Salaries of the Judge and the Recorder of the Westbrook Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1909, c. 282, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 282 of the private and special laws of 1909, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. Salary of judge. The judge of said court shall receive a salary of ~~\$1200~~ \$1,500 per year, to be paid to him in quarterly payments from the county treasury of the county of Cumberland, which shall be in full for all his services as judge. All blanks, civil and criminal dockets

and record books required by said court shall be furnished by the county of Cumberland.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1909, c. 282, § 1, amended. The 3rd paragraph of section 1 of chapter 282 of the private and special laws of 1909, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Such recorder shall receive an annual salary of ~~\$400~~ \$500, in full for all services as such recorder, which salary shall be paid to him in quarterly payments from the county treasury of the county of Cumberland.'

Chapter 96

AN ACT Relating to the Salaries of the Judge and the Recorder of the Bangor Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1895, c. 211, § 11, amended. Section 11 of chapter 211 of the private and special laws of 1895, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 11. Salaries. Said court shall be held at such ~~places~~ place as the city of Bangor shall provide and said city shall have power and it shall be its duty to raise money ~~and to~~ provide a proper place for said court and its officers and suitably furnish, warm and light the same, for which there shall be paid from the county of Penobscot, as rental, in quarterly payments, the sum of \$1,000 annually. The salaries of the judge and clerk thereof, which are hereby fixed at ~~twenty three hundred dollars~~ \$2,700 and ~~twenty one hundred dollars~~ \$2,500, respectively, to be paid ~~quarterly~~ monthly, with all other expenses of said court, shall be paid from the treasury of the county of Penobscot, and in addition thereto there shall be provided the sum of ~~seven hundred and fifty dollars~~ \$1,800 a per year for clerk hire, to be paid monthly from said treasury; provided, however, that the county commissioners of said county may in their discretion expend a larger amount, not exceeding \$500 per year, for the employment of extra clerks.'
