Chapter 107

AN ACT Relating to a State Police Barrack in the County of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Establishment of a barrack. The governor and council are hereby directed and authorized to purchase such land in the county of Cumberland for the use of the state as may be necessary for the erection of a state police barrack. There shall be erected, equipped, and maintained, under the supervision of the chief of the state police, on said land in the county of Cumberland, a state police barrack.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated \$22,500 from the general highway fund and \$2,500 from the general fund for the purchase of said land and the erection and equipping of said barrack.

Chapter 108

AN ACT Relating to School Committee in Town of Rumford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1935, c. 48, § 2, 1st ¶, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 2 of chapter 48 of the private and special laws of 1935 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The governing boards and officers of the town, to be balloted upon and elected by the qualified voters at the annual town meeting as hereinafter provided, shall be: A board of 5 selectmen, who shall be ex officio overseers of the poor, a ~~superintending~~ school committee of 3 5, a board of assessors of 3, a tax collector, town treasurer and a town clerk.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1935, c. 48, § 2, 3rd ¶, amended. The 3rd paragraph of section 2 of chapter 48 of the private and special laws of 1935 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'As the members of the ~~superintending~~ school committee are now elected each for a 3 year term, those whose term has not expired when this act, as amended, shall take effect shall continue to serve until their term expires.'
