Chapter 13

RESOLVE, in Favor of Noncontributory Pension Status of Anna F. Crowley of Biddeford.

Credit given Anna F. Crowley. Resolved: That Anna F. Crowley of Biddeford be given credit for 8 full years of teaching service rendered in Thornton Academy and such additional service, as she may hereafter render in said institution, to be applied toward meeting requirements for a noncontributory teacher's pension.

Chapter 14

RESOLVE, Relating to Old Printed Laws.

State librarian may remove excess copies of printed laws. Resolved: That the librarian of the Maine state library is hereby authorized to remove from the library reserve any excess copies of printed laws, exclusive of the most recent revision of the statutes and subsequent session laws, and to make such disposition of them as may seem proper; provided, however, that a sufficient number of each publication shall be retained to take care of the needs of the library and the legislature.

Chapter 15

RESOLVE, Relating to Printed Vital Records.

State librarian may remove excess copies of printed vital records. Resolved: That the librarian of the Maine state library is hereby authorized to remove from storage any excess copies of printed vital records, and to make such disposition of them as may seem proper; provided, however, that a sufficient number of each publication shall be retained to take care of the needs of the library and the legislature.
