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## Chapter 21

**RESOLVE, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Convey Certain Interest of the State in Lands in Oxford County to Harland E. Kimball, of West Bethel.**

Forest commissioner authorized to convey certain lands. Resolved: That the forest commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized to convey to Harland E. Kimball, of West Bethel, whatever interest the state has in land in 50 acres, Lots 3 and 4, R. 7, Mason township, Oxford county for the sum of \$187.72.

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## Chapter 22

**RESOLVE, Appropriating Money for Forest Insect Detection Service.**

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, the regular appropriation request for forest insect detection service will not become available until July 1; and

Whereas, it is urgent that such work be started not later than May 14; and

Whereas, no other funds are available; and

Whereas, the adjoining provinces in Canada are seriously infested with Spruce Budworm; and

Whereas, the state of Maine should take every step to be ready to combat any continued spread eastward that would enter the state; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of Section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

**Forest insect detection service; appropriation.** Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for forest insect detection service the sum of \$2,886 for the period May 14, 1945 to July 1, 1945 to be expended under the direction of the forest commissioner.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

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### Chapter 23

**RESOLVE, Authorizing Conveyance of the Interest of the State in Certain Land in Albany Township.**

Forest commissioner authorized to convey certain land. Resolved: That the forest commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized to sell to the Casco Loan & Building Association of Portland, the interest of the state in certain land and buildings thereon, in Lot 13, Range 11 and Lot 14, Range 11, formerly owned by Margaret Witham, for the sum of \$75.

Effective July 21, 1945

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### Chapter 24

**RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Goose Pond in Hancock County.**

Goose pond; opened to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Goose pond, on Swan's Island, in Hancock county, to fishing under the general law.

Effective July 21, 1945

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### Chapter 25

**RESOLVE, Closing Tributaries of Kennebago Stream to all Fishing.**

Kennebago stream tributaries closed to all fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation closing the tributaries of Kennebago stream in Franklin and Oxford counties to all fishing.
