Chapter 43

RESOLVE, in Favor of Cora Porter of Mapleton.

Retirement pension for Cora Porter. Resolved: That Cora Porter, of Mapleton, a teacher in the public schools of the state, shall be eligible for retirement by, on, or after July 1, 1945.

Chapter 44

RESOLVE, in Favor of Irving Crockett, of Durham.

Irving Crockett; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$175 from the appropriation for the department of agriculture to be paid to Irving Crockett, of Durham, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damage to 4 heifers by dogs, said sum to be paid from the dog tax fund.

Chapter 45

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Convey Argyle Grange Hall in Penobscot County to Alton Grange No. 411.

Forest commissioner authorized to convey Argyle grange hall. Resolved: That the forest commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized to convey to Alton Grange No. 411, Penobscot county, the Argyle Grange Hall building if same is removed from the land within 1 year, for the sum of \$1.
