Chapter 52

RESOLVE, in Favor of James R. Hale of Castine.

James R. Hale, compensated. Resolved: That the department of agriculture be authorized to pay to James R. Hale, of Castine, the sum of \$75 being $\frac{1}{2}$ payment for a cow which died as a result of eating grass covered with spray material, provided that the town of Castine pays to James R. Hale an equal amount, both to be in full payment.

Chapter 53

RESOLVE, Providing for Purchase of Land and Buildings for the State Reformatory for Women.

Purchase of land and buildings for state reformatory for women, authorized. Resolved: That the commissioner of institutional service be, and hereby is, authorized to purchase for use by the state reformatory for women land and buildings, situated in the town of Skowhegan and now owned by L. A. Caswell of said Skowhegan, according to the terms expressed in an option dated January 31, 1945; and be it further

Resolved: That the sum of \$3,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the unappropriated surplus account.

Chapter 54

RESOLVE, Providing for Purchase of Land for the Maine State Prison.

Maine state prison; purchase of land provided for. Resolved: That the commissioner of institutional service be, and hereby is, authorized to purchase for use by the Maine state prison, land and buildings situated in the towns of Warren and Cushing now owned by George E. Counce, of Warren, according to the terms expressed in an option dated January 12, 1945, and that the sum of \$12,300 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the unappropriated surplus account.
