Chapter 55

RESOLVE, in Favor of Guy Brown of Guilford.

Guy Brown; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,000 to be paid to Guy Brown, of Guilford, for hospital expenses caused by injuries from rifle shots fired by a boy under suspended sentence to the State School for Boys at South Portland and released under probation; said sum to be paid from the general fund of the state.

Chapter 56

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Lincolnville.

Town of Lincolnville; reimbursed. Resolved: That the sum of \$1,622.09 be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the town of Lincolnville, to reimburse said town for expenses incurred in employing the state guard in fighting forest fires in said town of Lincolnville; said sum to be paid from the general fund of the state.

Chapter 57

RESOLVE, in Favor of Louis F. Fleming, of Bangor.

Louis F. Fleming; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,000 to be paid to Louis F. Fleming, of Bangor, to compensate him for acting as member of the State Liquor Commission from July 8, 1935 to November 9, 1935; said sum to be paid from the state liquor commission appropriation.
