Resolved: That the county taxes of the several counties for the year 1945 may be apportioned during the month of April of said year upon the last state valuation.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 62

RESOLVE, for the Laying of the County Taxes for the Year Nineteen Hundred Forty-six.

County taxes apportioned. Resolved: That the sum appearing opposite to the names of the counties in the following schedule is hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied to the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and for the purposes of law, for the year 1946.

Chapter 63

RESOLVE, in Favor of Mary Louise Bernier, of Sanford.

Mary Louise Bernier; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$157.48 from the general fund of the state to be paid to Mary Louise Bernier, of Sanford, as a full and final settlement for her claim against the state for personal injury by a muskrat.

Chapter 64

RESOLVE, Granting a State Pension to Eva M. Farrington Cary, of Bowdoinham.

Eva M. Farrington Cary; state pension. Resolved: That an annual pension of \$375 be granted to Eva M. Farrington Cary, of Bowdoinham, to be paid quarterly from the state school fund. Said pension shall begin July 1, 1945, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 65

RESOLVE, in Favor of Dr. Charles H. Buck, of Naples.

Dr. Charles H. Buck; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$187.50 to be paid to Dr. Charles H. Buck, of Naples, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damage to poultry by foxes; said sum to be paid from the dog tax fund.
