Chapter 85

RESOLVE, Relating to Retirement Pension for Percy E. Averill, of Thomaston.

Percy E. Averill; retirement pension. Resolved: That Percy E. Averill, of Thomaston, now serving as night watch at the Maine State Prison, is hereby made eligible to receive a retirement pension under the provisions of section 3 of chapter 60 of the revised statutes of 1944.

Chapter 86

RESOLVE, To Appoint a State Board for Approval of Institutions Offering Specialized Training.

State board for approval of institutions offering specialized training. Resolved: The state board of vocational education is hereby authorized to act as the state board of approval of institutions offering specialized training. Such board shall pass upon the eligibility of institutions which may now or hereafter make application for authority to provide education or training beyond that offered by the secondary schools to veterans under the provisions of the "Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944", excepting degree-granting institutions and apprentice-training or in-service-training courses; and be it further

Resolved: That a list of such institutions approved by the board be furnished the Veterans Administration in charge of administering the provisions of the federal bill cited as the "Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944".

Chapter 87

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Convey Certain Interest of the State in Land in Aroostook County to George Emile Daigle and Adrian Daigle.

Forest commissioner authorized to convey certain land. Resolved: That the forest commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized to convey to

George Emile Daigle and Adrian Daigle, of Sinclair, whatever interest the state has in Township number 17, Range 4, W. E. L. S., Aroostook county, containing 68.35 acres more or less, for the sum of \$84.62.

Chapter 88

RESOLVE, in Favor of Cornelius E. Conley, of Lewiston.

Cornelius E. Conley; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$3,000, to be paid to Cornelius E. Conley, of Lewiston, to compensate him in full for all claims against the state for damages and injuries sustained by him during his employment with the Maine State Liquor Commission; said sum to be paid from the general fund of the state.

Chapter 89

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Smyrna.

Town of Smyrna; account charged off. Resolved: That the state controller be, and hereby is, authorized to charge off the sum of \$2,250.60 now charged against the town of Smyrna for board and care of various persons during the years 1936 to 1942.

Chapter 90

RESOLVE, in Favor of Town of Greenville to Correct Height of Overpass of the Canadian Pacific Railroad at Greenville Junction.

Town of Greenville; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general highway fund the sum of \$2,500 for the purpose of correcting the height of the overpass of the Canadian Pacific Railroad at Greenville Junction, which overpass crosses state highway No. 15, and be it further
