Chapter 104

RESOLVE, Providing for an Interim Commission to Study Methods to Assure Greater Productivity of the Forest Lands of the State.

Interim commission; appointment. Resolved: That the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized and directed to appoint 9 competent persons to constitute a commission for the study and analysis of measures to assure greater productivity of forest growth in the state, and such study shall give consideration to the effect of taxation upon the conservation of the state's timberland resources.

The commission may request the state forest commissioner and the state tax assessor to advise and assist it in securing basic data that may be required for its study.

The members of said commission shall serve without salary or other remuneration.

Said commission shall make a report of its studies, with any legislation it deems necessary, to the 93rd legislature.

Chapter 105

RESOLVE, Authorizing Preparation of a Digest of the Opinions of the Law Court.

Preparation of digest authorized. Resolved: That the attorney-general be, and hereby is, authorized and instructed to compile a digest of the opinions of the law court of the state of Maine in such order and form as shall seem best to him after taking the opinions of the members of the bar of the state. To aid him in this work, he is empowered to employ one or more competent and experienced members of the bar and such clerical assistance as may be necessary; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the governor and council are hereby authorized to provide for the printing and sale of the digest to the end that as nearly as possible the expense of the state shall be fully defrayed. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this resolve the sum of \$10,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1946 is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the state. Any unexpended balances shall not lapse, but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this resolve have been accomplished.
