This construction shall begin as soon as practicable and prudent, contingent upon the availability of materials and labor and upon such conditions and restrictions as the governor and council may from time to time prescribe.

Chapter 114

RESOLVE, in Favor of Harold Kromer, of LaGrange.

Harold Kromer; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$25 to be paid to Harold Kromer, of La-Grange, as a full and final settlement of all claims for damage to his car by deer; said sum to be paid from the funds of the inland fisheries and game fund.

Chapter 115

RESOLVE, for the Maintenance and Repair of Roads and Bridges.

Maintenance and repair of roads and bridges. Resolved: That there be and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$150,000 for the fiscal period ending June 30, 1945 and \$150,000 for the fiscal period ending June 30, 1946 to aid in repairing and maintaining such highways and bridges as hereinafter specified, to be paid from the general highway fund as by special resolves. And there is hereby further appropriated \$18,000 from the general highway fund to be paid to the towns as specified below. Provided, however, that no appropriation herein contained shall be available unless the town designated to receive the same shall undertake that all road

material, including clay, gravel, sand and rock, necessary for the improvement contemplated by this resolve shall be furnished without expense to the state, and that each town shall assume and pay all damages whatsoever arising from the taking of land or from the change of grade, drainage or alignment deemed by the state highway commission as necessary for said improvement. The expenditure of all sums of money provided by this resolve shall be under the supervision of the state highway commission.

Any balance of appropriation remaining unexpended at the end of any fiscal period shall be available for the same on any succeeding fiscal year.

Minot. To aid in repairing the Garfield road, so called, leading towards West Minot; this being a continuation of work done under previous special resolve.

Poland. To aid in repairing the road leading from the Summit Spring Hotel to the Middle Range pond, work to begin where work ended under previous special resolve.

Turner. To aid in repairing the road beginning at North Turner on route 219.

Wales. To aid in repairing the Andrews road, so called, beginning from the third class road about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile from route 126 at the residence of Roy Hinckley past the residence of O. D. Caswell Plantation. To aid in repairing the road beginning at the state road near the Methodist church and running in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately I mile.

Chapman. To aid in repairing the West Chapman road, so called, beginning where work ended under previous special resolve and connecting with state aid road No. 1; a distance of approximately 500 feet.

Crystal. To aid in repairing Retreat road, so called, running from state aid road from Island Falls to the Patten-Hersey town line road, a distance of approximately I mile.

Limestone. To aid in repairing the road beginning at state highway K-2 or No. 165, and running in a westerly direction to its intersection with the Obar road, so called, a distance of approximately I mile.

Limestone. Monticello. To aid in repairing the Wilkins road, so called, beginning from highway No. 1, running north and south a distance of 3 miles from the village of Monticello.

Monticello. To aid in repairing the north part of said road running east and west to point on route one, known as the Britten road.

New Canada Plantation. To aid in repairing the Jos. Lamore road, so called, beginning from New Canada road cutting across to Caribou road, so called, or state highway K 14.

Certain construction at Augusta State Hospital. Resolved: That the sum of \$350,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated out of the unappropriated surplus of the general fund for repairs, construction and equipment at the Augusta State Hospital.

This appropriation shall not lapse and shall be carried forward from year to year. This construction and repairs shall be carried out upon such conditions and restrictions as the governor and council may from time to time prescribe when they deem it prudent.

Effective July 21, 1945
