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Supplementary to the Resolves of 1945

Chapter 117

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Charleston.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, due to error the following resolve was omitted from the final report of the legislative committee on ways and bridges at the last session of the legislature; and

Whereas, it is essential that the roads herein mentioned should be repaired before the winter season begins; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16, part third, article IV of the constitution of Maine as enacted by article XXXI, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Town of Charleston; appropriation for. Resolved: That the money appropriated in favor of the town of Charleston by the 92nd legislature for the tarring of the road beginning at end of tarred road north of Charleston village and running toward Atkinson corner, be and hereby is reappropriated to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1947, as follows:

\$500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1947 to aid in repairing the road

beginning at the state aid road and extending in a westerly direction on the so called Lawrence Higgins road;

\$450 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1947 to aid in repairing the North road, so called, beginning at the state road running from Charleston to Atkinson and running east to the Duthie farm.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 118

RESOLVE in Favor of Ricker Classical Institute and Junior College.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, there has developed throughout the state a situation of scarcity of college and secondary school facilities, due to the return of veterans of World War II for whom the federal government, under the G. I. Bill of Rights, so called, has committed itself to finance secondary and college education; and

Whereas, Ricker Classical Institute and Junior College, after total destruction of its main building, containing class rooms, laboratories and gymnasium, by fire, in March, 1944, has, by private subscription of \$145,000, rebuilt such building to a point where the sum of \$50,000 would complete said building and equip it for a two-year college course and secondary school; and

Whereas, the appropriation of said sum of \$50,000 by the state would provide two-year college facilities for 150 veterans in addition to the secondary school students entering during the fall of the current year; and

Whereas, the purpose of this resolve is to provide for the welfare of the people of the state, and particularly veterans of World War II, during this period of economic readjustment; and

Whereas, the foregoing facts in the judgment of this legislature constitute an emergency within the meaning of section 16, part third, article IV of the constitution of Maine as enacted by article XXXI, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Resolved: That the sum of \$50,000 be appropriated from the Maine Post War Public Works Reserve to be expended by the president and board of trustees of Ricker Classical Institute and Junior College for the purpose of completion and equipment of its main school building and for
