Chapter 28

AN ACT Relating to Farm Bureau Assistance in Piscataquis County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 27, § 239, amended. Section 239 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

Provided, however, that in Piscataquis county, the county commissioners shall allow not less than \$4,000 per year.

Sec. 2. Duration of act. The provisions of this act shall remain in force and effect only for a period of 2 years.

Chapter 29

AN ACT Relating to Exemptions from Taxation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 81, § 6, sub-§ X, amended. Subsection X of section 6 of chapter 81 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

X. The polls and the estates of persons who by reason of age, infirmity or poverty are in the judgment of the assessors unable to contribute toward the public charges; the polls of all soldiers and sailors who served in the army or navy of the United States in the war of 1861-1865 and were honorably discharged or honorably separated from such service; the polls of all soldiers, sailors and marines who receive state pension; the polls of all soldiers, sailors and marines who served in the Indian wars; the polls of all soldiers, sailors and marines who served in the war with Spain; the polls of all soldiers, sailors and marines who served in the Philippine Insurrection; the polls of all disabled veterans of World Wars I and II, namely, soldiers, sailors and marines who are receiving pension or retirement pay or compensation or vocational training from the United States Government on account of disability incurred in or aggravated by service in World Wars I or II; and the estates, to the value of \$3,500 of all male or female veterans who have served in the armed forces of the United States during any federally recognized war period and who were honorably discharged, or honorably separated from such service and retired to the reserve, who shall have reached the age of 62 years or are receiving a pension, retirement pay or compensation from the United States Veterans' Administration Govern-
