## Chapter 77

### AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Town Officers' Neglect in Fire Prevention.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 85, § 52, amended. Section 52 of chapter 85 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 52. Penalty for town officers' refusal. Every municipal officer or fire inspector or chief of a fire department who refuses ~~or neglects~~ to perform the duties imposed upon him by the 7 preceding sections forfeits \$50.'

## Chapter 78

### AN ACT Repealing the Law Relating to Prior Convictions in Offenses Against the Liquor Law.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 57, § 72, repealed. Section 72 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.

## Chapter 79

### AN ACT Relating to Income Accruing to the State.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 15, § 8, amended. The 1st sentence of section 8 of chapter 15 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'It shall be the duty of the treasurer of state to receive and keep a record of all items of income accruing to the state **not paid within 90 days**, including taxes levied by the state, and all such items shall be promptly certified to the treasurer of state **at the close of each month** by the department, bureau, institution, or agency of state government where such items of income originate or by which such taxes are assessed.'
