Chapter 97

AN ACT Relating to Hours of Sale of Liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 57, § 36, amended. The 1st sentence of section 36 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No malt liquors shall be sold in this state on Sundays or on the day of holding a general election or state-wide primary and no licensee by himself, clerk, servant or agent shall between the hours of midnight and 6 A. M. sell or deliver any malt liquors, except no malt liquors shall be sold or delivered on Saturdays after 11:45 P. M.; provided, however, that the commission by rule and regulation may set hours for sale which will give effect to daylight saving time during times when the same is in effect.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 57, § 53, amended. The 1st sentence of section 53 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No spirituous or vinous liquor shall be sold in this state on Sundays or on the day of holding a general election or state-wide primary and no licensee by himself, clerk, servant or agent shall between the hours of midnight and 6 A. M. sell or deliver any spirituous or vinous liquors, except no spirituous or vinous liquors shall be sold or delivered on Saturdays after 11:45 P. M.; provided, however, that the commission by rule and regulation may set hours for sale which will give effect to daylight saving time during times when the same is in effect.'

Chapter 98

AN ACT Designating Through Ways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 78, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 78 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'For the purposes of this section, the state highway commission may from time to time designate certain state and state aid highways and county and town ways connecting such state and state aid highways as "through ways," and may after notice revoke any such designation; provided, however, that within the compact or built-up portion of any city, town or village as defined in section 102 such designation of through

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ways shall be made by the state highway commission only with the approval of the municipal officers thereof, and further provided that the state highway commission after notice shall revoke such designation upon the petition of the said municipal officers. No such designation of a through way shall become effective as to regulation of traffic at such a point of intersection until said commission shall have caused suitable warning signs or signals to be erected at or near such point. Such signs and signals shall be prima facie evidence that said signs and signals were erected in accordance with the provisions of this section. For the purposes of this section, a way joining a through way at an angle, whether or not it crosses the same, shall be deemed to intersect it, and the word "way," unless the context other requires, shall include a through or other way.'

Chapter 99

AN ACT Relating to Revocation of Hunting Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 33, § 63, sub-§ IX, repealed. Subsection IX of section 63 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 33, § 125, amended. Section 125 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

'The hunting license of any such person convicted under the provisions of this section shall be immediately revoked by the commissioner and such person shall not thereafter be eligible to procure a hunting license; provided, however, that such license shall not be revoked pending appeal.'
