Chapter 303

AN ACT to Increase the Amount for Clerk Hire in the Office of Register of Probate in York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 269, amended. That part of section 269 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 224 of the public laws of 1945, relating to clerk hire in the office of register of probate in York county, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'for clerks in the office of register of probate, ~~\$3,000~~ \$3,680;'

Chapter 304

AN ACT Relating to Clerk Hire in the Office of Clerk of Courts in Hancock County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 269, amended. That part of section 269 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, which relates to clerk hire in the office of clerk of courts in Hancock county, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, ~~\$1,000~~ \$1,375.'

Chapter 305

AN ACT Relating to Testing of Water Supplies for Public Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 121-A, additional. Chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 121-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 121-A. Schools obtaining water for drinking or culinary purposes from sources other than municipal systems required to submit samples for examination. The department shall, during each school year, require the school officials of any city, town or plantation to have submitted samples of water for chemical and bacteriological examination, if such water is
