are then legal voters of said town and reside in said district, and all notices, warrants or other proceedings shall be varied accordingly so as to show that only such voters as reside in said district as aforesaid are entitled to vote upon the above question. Such special elections shall be called, advertised and conducted according to the law relating to municipal elections; provided, however, the municipal officers shall not be required to prepare nor the town clerk to post a new list of voters; and for this purpose said municipal officers shall be in session on the secular day next preceding said election, and on the day of said election until the polls are closed, the days to be devoted to registration of voters and to the verification and correction of said lists and to complete and close up its records of said session. Absent voting ballots shall not be used. The town clerk shall reduce the subject of this act to the following question: "Shall the act to incorporate the Corinna Water District be accepted?" and the voters shall indicate by a cross placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. The result shall be declared by the municipal officers and due certificate thereof filed with the secretary of state by the clerk of said town.

Sec. 15. Act effective for referendum. Despite the provisions of section 14 hereof providing for acceptance of this act by vote of the district, this act shall take effect 90 days after the final adjournment of the legislature for all purposes and for the performance of all acts, including the calling and holding of the special elections authorized in section 14, necessary or permissible hereunder until the act be accepted in accordance with section 14 whereupon the act takes complete effect.

Sec. 16. Rights conferred subject to provisions of law. All the rights and duties herein mentioned shall be exercised and performed in accordance with all the applicable provisions of chapter 40 of the revised statutes, and all acts amendatory thereof or additional thereto.

Chapter 87

AN ACT Permitting Trustees of Berwick Academy to Issue Bonds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Trustees of Berwick academy permitted to issue bonds. The trustees of Berwick academy, acting in its name and behalf, are hereby authorized to issue negotiable bonds in a sum not exceeding \$175,000 for the purpose of procuring funds to construct and equip a gymnasium building to be

located on the grounds of said academy for the use of its students and such others as the trustees may authorize. Said bonds shall be of such denominations, maturities and interest rate, as said trustees shall fix, and payment thereof may be secured by a mortgage on said gymnasium building and equipment, together with such lot of land whereon said building stands as said trustees shall determine.

Chapter 88

AN ACT Relating to Incorporation of Kittery Water District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1907, c. 424, § 10, sub-§ IV, additional. Section 10 of chapter 424 of the private and special laws of 1907 is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered IV, to read as follows:

'IV. After the retirement of all of the obligations of the District, if any surplus remains at the end of the year, then a part of said surplus, not to exceed 50% of the amount earned in that year, may be paid to the town of Kittery to be used to support and maintain municipal facilities within the District.'

Chapter 89

AN ACT to Designate Route 11 in Aroostook County as the Aroostook Scenic Highway.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The "Aroostook Scenic Highway", designated. The highway known as Route 11, in Aroostook county, commencing at the south line of the town of Hersey and extending northerly to the Canadian boundary, is hereby designated as the "Aroostook Scenic Highway".
