Chapter 90

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Judge of the Lincoln Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1913, c. 239, § 19, amended. The 3rd paragraph of section 19 of chapter 239 of the private and special laws of 1913, as amended by section 6 of chapter 296 of the public laws of 1939, and by chapter 58 of the private and special laws of 1943, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'The judge of said court shall receive the salary of ~~\$7,100~~ \$1,500 per year, to be paid him in equal quarterly payments from the county treasury of Lincoln county, which shall be in full for his services as such judge, except as hereinbefore provided.'

Chapter 91

AN ACT Relating to the Salaries of the Judge and of the Recorder of the Old Town Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1903, c. 153, § 9, amended. Section 9 of chapter 153 of the private and special laws of 1903, as amended by chapter 83 of the private and special laws of 1937, and by chapter 89 of the private and special laws of 1945, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 9. Location of court; salary of judge; salary of recorder. Said court shall be held at such place as the city of Old Town shall provide and said city shall have power and it shall be its duty to raise money to provide a proper place for said court and its officers and suitably furnish, warm and light the same. The salary of the judge of said court shall be ~~\$7,100~~ \$1,700, annually; that of the recorder, ~~\$800~~ \$1,100, annually, and both of said salaries are to be paid quarterly, with all other expenses of said court, from the treasury of the county of Penobscot, and such additional amount for clerk hire as may be authorized by the county commissioners.'
