Chapter 129

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams in Lamoine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Digging of clams in Lamoine, regulated; penalty. No clams shall be taken from any flats within the limits of the town of Lamoine, in Hancock county, by any non-residents of said town; provided, however, that any person temporarily resident therein or any non-resident riparian owner of any such flats may take therefrom for the immediate use of himself or his family not exceeding 1 bushel of clams at 1 tide. A resident shall mean a person who has resided in this state for the term of at least 6 consecutive months, and in the town of Lamoine for 3 consecutive months.

Whoever violates any of the above provisions shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$50, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Chapter 130

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams in Southwest Harbor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Digging of clams in Southwest Harbor, regulated; penalty. No clams shall be taken from any flats within the limits of the town of Southwest Harbor, in Hancock county, by any non-residents of said town; provided, however, that any person temporarily resident therein or any non-resident riparian owner of any such flats may take therefrom for the immediate use of himself or his family not exceeding 1 bushel of clams at 1 tide. A resident shall mean a person who has resided in this state for the term of at least 6 consecutive months, and in the town of Southwest Harbor for 3 consecutive months.

Whoever violates any of the above provisions shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$50, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
