ing office by virtue of the provisions of law shall serve out the terms for which they were appointed.

The members of the school board holding office when this charter goes into effect shall not serve out the terms for which they were appointed but shall serve only until the members of the school committee are elected and qualified as hereinbefore provided.

Sec. 7. Certain provisions continued. All rights, actions, proceedings, prosecutions and contracts of the city or any of its departments, pending or unexecuted when this charter goes into effect and not inconsistent therewith, shall be enforced, continued or completed in all respects as though begun or executed hereunder.

Sec. 8. Repealing clause. In case this act is approved in the manner hereinbefore provided, all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Chapter 173

AN ACT Relating to the Payment of Fines and Costs and the Salary of the Judge of the Municipal Court in the Town of East Livermore, now Livermore Falls.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1899, c. 120, § 13, amended. Section 13 of chapter 120 of the private and special laws of 1899, as amended by chapter 73 of the private and special laws of 1915, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 13. Payment of fines and costs; salary of judge. All fees, civil and criminal, shall inure to the county of Androscoggin and shall be paid over to the treasurer of said county by said judge ~~on the first day of each month~~ in accordance with the provisions of section 5 of chapter 137 of the revised statutes of 1944 and amendments thereto. The judge of said court shall receive an annual salary of ~~six hundred dollars~~ \$1,200 in full for all services, payable ~~quarterly, on the first days of April, July, October and January~~ weekly from the treasury of Androscoggin county.'
