Chapter 48

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Patten.

Town of Patten; money reallocated. Resolved: That the money appropriated in favor of the town of Patten by previous legislatures which was originally designated to be used at the foot of Ash Hill, near the turn of the Happy Corner road, so called, be and hereby is, reallocated to be expended in the ensuing years on state aid No. 4, known as the Happy Corner road.

Chapter 49

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Montville.

Town of Montville; money reallocated. Resolved: That the money appropriated in favor of the town of Montville by the 91st and 92nd legislatures for the repairing of the road leading from Center Montville to Morrill town line, be and hereby is, reallocated to be expended in the ensuing fiscal years on the road leading from Center Montville south-easterly to the Searsmont town line, connecting with third class designation No. 4 in said Searsmont.

Chapter 50

RESOLVE, Reallocating Road Resolve Money Previously Allocated to Road in Damariscotta.

Town of Damariscotta; reallocation of road resolve money. Resolved: That the sum of \$4,150 which was made available as special road resolves to the town of Damariscotta by chapter 146 of the resolves of 1941, by chapter 67 of the resolves of 1943, and by chapter 115 of the resolves of 1945, and allotted for the Bristol road, so called, be reallocated to take care of the cost of construction made in 1946 on High street and the Hospital road.
