Chapter 66

RESOLVE, Authorizing the State Tax Assessor to Convey Certain Interest of the State in Lands in Hancock County to Malcom P. Noyes, of Franklin.

State tax assessor authorized to convey certain lands. Resolved: That the state tax assessor be, and hereby is, authorized to convey to Malcom P. Noyes, of Franklin, whatever interest the state has in lot in E. part, described as follows: Beginning on W. line of Steuben at S. E. corner of Eastern Pulpwood Co.; thence S. on said town line to settlers' lot 4; thence W. about 50 chains to N. W. corner of lot 4; thence S. to N. W. corner of Ira Tracy; thence W. along E. W. Wallace N. line to S. E. corner of Willis B. Goodwin land; thence N. about 100 chains to N. line of said Goodwin; thence E. to Whitten-Parrin stream; thence N. E. up said stream to S. line of Eastern Pulpwood Co.; thence E. along said S. line to point of beginning. Reference to deed recorded in Hancock Registry, vol. 683, page 420, in 7 South Division, Hancock county, containing 957 acres, more or less, for the sum of \$250.

Chapter 67

RESOLVE, Closing the South Branch of Penobscot River to All Fishing After Certain Date.

South Branch of Penobscot river; closed to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close the South Branch of the Penobscot river from its source in Sandy Bay township to Penobscot brook to all fishing after August 15th of each year.

Chapter 68

RESOLVE, Closing Tributaries of South Branch of Penobscot River to All Fishing.

Tributaries of South branch of Penobscot river; closed to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close

to all fishing the tributaries of the South branch of the Penobscot river from its source in Sandy Bay township to the mouth of Penobscot brook.

Chapter 69

RESOLVE, Closing Tributaries to Moose River to All Fishing.

Tributaries to Moose river; closed to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close to all fishing all tributaries to Moose river beginning at the Franklin-Somerset county line and continuing to Brassua lake, except Holeb stream, Barret brook, Wood stream, Sandy stream, Heald stream, Little Churchill, Big Churchill, Parlin stream, but including Mountain brook a tributary to Parlin stream.

RESOLVE, Establishing the Opening Date for Fishing for White Perch in Ebeemee Lake, T. 5, R. 9, N. W. P. and Brownville in Piscataquis County.

Establishing the opening date for fishing for white perch in Ebeemee lake, T. 5, R. 9, N. W. P. and Brownville in Piscataquis county. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, be and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing the opening date for fishing for white perch in Ebeemee lake, T. 5, R. 9, N. W. P. and Brownville in the county of Piscataquis to be June 21st each year.

Chapter 71

RESOLVE, Opening Virginia Lake in the Town of Stoneham to Ice Fishing.

Virginia lake opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to open Virginia lake in the town of Stoneham, Oxford county, to ice fishing for pickerel and yellow perch only.
