RESOLVES, 1947**CHAP. 71**

to all fishing the tributaries of the South branch of the Penobscot river from its source in Sandy Bay township to the mouth of Penobscot brook.

Effective August 13, 1947

Chapter 69

RESOLVE, Closing Tributaries to Moose River to All Fishing.

Tributaries to Moose river; closed to fishing. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close to all fishing all tributaries to Moose river beginning at the Franklin-Somerset county line and continuing to Brassua lake, except Holeb stream, Barret brook, Wood stream, Sandy stream, Heald stream, Little Churchill, Big Churchill, Parlin stream, but including Mountain brook a tributary to Parlin stream.

RESOLVE, Establishing the Opening Date for Fishing for White Perch in Ebeemee Lake, T. 5, R. 9, N. W. P. and Brownville in Piscataquis County.

Establishing the opening date for fishing for white perch in Ebeemee lake, T. 5, R. 9, N. W. P. and Brownville in Piscataquis county. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, be and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing the opening date for fishing for white perch in Ebeemee lake, T. 5, R. 9, N. W. P. and Brownville in the county of Piscataquis to be June 21st each year.

Effective August 13, 1947

Chapter 71

RESOLVE, Opening Virginia Lake in the Town of Stoneham to Ice Fishing.

Virginia lake opened to ice fishing. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to open Virginia lake in the town of Stoneham, Oxford county, to ice fishing for pickerel and yellow perch only.

Effective August 13, 1947
