### RESOLVE, Closing Mountain Catcher Pond in Penobscot County to Ice Fishing.

Mountain Catcher pond, closed to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Mountain Catcher pond in Township 6, Range 8, in Penobscot county, to ice fishing.

## Chapter 77

### RESOLVE, Closing Pleasant Pond, in Oxford County, to Ice Fishing.

Pleasant pond, Oxford county; closed to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Pleasant pond, in the town of Sumner, Oxford county, to ice fishing.

## Chapter 78

### RESOLVE, Authorizing Warren Worster of Greenville to Construct a Wharf.

Warren Worster authorized to construct a wharf. Resolved: That Warren Worster, of Greenville, be and hereby is, authorized to construct a wharf at the cove in Greenville extending from his land into Moosehead lake a distance of not more than 100 feet.
