## Chapter 95

**RESOLVE, Authorizing the State Tax Assessor to Convey Certain Interest of the State in Land in Aroostook County to Maxime J. Michaud, of St. Agatha.**

State tax assessor authorized to convey certain lands. **Resolved:** That the state tax assessor be, and hereby is, authorized to convey to Maxime J. Michaud, of St. Agatha, whatever interest the state has in lot 12 in N. half, according to plan by Joseph Sewall in 1886, with buildings, in T. 17, R. 4, W. E. L. S., Aroostook county, containing 25 acres more or less, for the sum of \$199.44.

## Chapter 96

**RESOLVE, Authorizing the State Tax Assessor to Convey Certain Land in Aroostook County to Maxime F. Albert, of Frenchville.**

State tax assessor authorized to convey certain lands. **Resolved:** That the state tax assessor be, and hereby is, authorized to convey to Maxime F. Albert, of Frenchville, whatever interest the state may have in the following described lots:

1. Lot 21 in N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  according to plan by Joseph Sewall in 1886. With buildings, 37 acres more or less. (17, R. 4, W. E. L. S., Aroostook).
2. Part lot 24 in N. half according to plan of N. half by Joseph Sewall in 1886. With buildings, 37 acres more or less. (17, R. 4, W. E. L. S., Aroostook).

## Chapter 97

**RESOLVE, to Create an Interim Committee to Study the Indian Problem.**

Interim legislative committee created; compensation; report. **Resolved:** There is hereby created an interim legislative committee to make a study of the Indian problem. The committee shall be composed of 3 members: one from the senate, to be appointed by the president of the senate and 2 from the house of representatives, to be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives. Each member shall receive \$10 per day and expenses while engaged in the work of this committee. The committee shall

report the results of their study at the next regular session of the legislature; and be it further

**Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated whatever sums are necessary, not to exceed \$500, to carry out the provisions of this resolve; and be it further

**Resolved:** That the expenses incurred under the provisions of this resolve shall be paid currently from the Indian accounts.

## Chapter 98

### RESOLVE, Opening Pleasant Lake, in Washington County, to Ice Fishing.

Pleasant lake; opened to ice fishing. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Pleasant lake, T. 6, R. 1 - T. 7, R. 2, Washington county, to ice fishing for all fish, except bass, during February on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, only.

### RESOLVE, Closing the Tributaries to Wassookeag Lake in Dexter in Penobscot County to All Fishing.

Closing the tributaries to Wassookeag lake in Dexter in Penobscot county to all fishing. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, be and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing the tributaries to Wassookeag lake in Dexter in the county of Penobscot to all fishing.

## Chapter 100

### RESOLVE, Regulating Dipping of Smelts in Lake Cobbosseecontee.

Lake Cobbosseecontee closed to smelt dipping. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close lake Cobbosseecontee in the county of Kennebec to the taking of smelts by dip-nets.
