## Chapter 115

### RESOLVE, Relating to Lands Reserved for Public Uses Trust.

Losses on impounded bank accounts; charged off. Resolved: That the treasurer of state and the state controller are hereby authorized to charge off and reduce the principal amount of the trust titled "Lands Reserved for Public Uses" in the sum of \$34,150.20 representing losses on impounded bank accounts of this trust; and be it further

Resolved: That the treasurer of state and the state controller are hereby authorized to charge off impounded income in the amount of \$1,461.86.

## Chapter 116

### RESOLVE, Relating to Impounded Bank Accounts of Kennebec Bridge Fund.

Impounded bank accounts of the Kennebec Bridge Fund, charged off. Resolved: That the treasurer of state and state controller are authorized to charge off on the records of the state the sum of \$31,468.60, representing losses on impounded bank accounts of the Kennebec (Carlton) Bridge Fund.

## Chapter 117

### RESOLVE, Opening the South Branch of Dead River and Tributaries (Except Nash Stream) to both Fly and Bait Fishing.

Opening the south branch of Dead river and tributaries (except Nash stream) to both fly and bait fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening the south branch of Dead river and tributaries (except Nash stream) to both fly and bait fishing with the daily limit of 10 fish per person per day, establishing a minimum length for trout at 8 inches and for salmon at 14 inches.
