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## Chapter 123

### RESOLVE, Relating to Impounded Bank Accounts.

Bank accounts, losses charged off. Resolved: That the treasurer of state and the state controller be and hereby are authorized to charge off on the records of the state the sum of \$129,898.63 representing losses on impounded bank accounts in the general fund of the state.

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## Chapter 124

### RESOLVE, Providing for a Fish Screen at Outlet of Kewayden Lake in the Town of Stoneham in the County of Oxford.

Providing for a fish screen at outlet of Kewayden lake in the town of Stoneham in the county of Oxford. Resolved: That the sum of \$1,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the legislative appropriation for the department of inland fisheries and game, for installing a fish screen at the outlet of Kewayden lake in the town of Stoneham in the county of Oxford; the balance necessary to complete this screen to be furnished in labor and materials by the inhabitants of the town of Stoneham; the screen to be kept free and clean of all debris at all times by the town of Stoneham.

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## Chapter 125

### RESOLVE, Designating U. S. Route No. 1 in Maine as a Blue Star Memorial Highway.

U. S. Route No. 1 in Maine, Blue Star Memorial Highway. Resolved: That U. S. Route No. 1 in Maine be designated as Blue Star Memorial Highway; and be it further

Resolved: That the Garden Club Federation of Maine is authorized to erect along said highway suitable tablets and ornamentations, subject to the approval of the state highway commission, to perpetuate the memory of the men and women of Maine who served in the armed forces of the United States in World War II.
