Chapter 157

RESOLVE, in Favor of Mrs. Ralph Cooper, of Madison.

Mrs. Ralph Cooper; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$125 to be paid to Mrs. Ralph Cooper of Madison, as a full and final settlement for her claim against the state for jewelry stolen by a state ward; said sum to be paid from the health and welfare fund.

Chapter 158

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Whiting for Transportation of State Children.

Town of Whiting; reimbursed. Resolved: That the sum of \$140 be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the town of Whiting, to reimburse said town for transportation of 3 state children to school; said sum to be paid from the educational funds.

Effective August 13, 1947

Chapter 159

RESOLVE, to Compensate Town of Houlton for Assisting Kingman to Fight Fire.

Town of Houlton; compensated. Resolved: That the sum of \$100 be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the town of Houlton to compensate said town for sending their fire truck and company of men to assist in fighting a fire in Kingman, an unorganized town which is a part of the forestry district; said sum to be paid from the Maine Forestry District fund.

Chapter 160

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Strong for Fighting Fire in Salem Township.

Town of Strong; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the Maine Forestry District Fund the sum of \$47, to be paid to the town of Strong fire department to reimburse such town's fire department for fighting fire in Salem township on November 24, 1946.
