Chapter 161

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Woodstock.

Town of Woodstock; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$339.34 from the appropriation for the department of inland fisheries and game to be paid to the town of Woodstock, as a full and final settlement for said town's claim against the state for damage on road and bridge at outlet of Lake Christopher in said town of Woodstock.

Chapter 162

RESOLVE, in Favor of Leola J. McCourt of Strong.

Leola J. McCourt; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$120 to be paid to Leola J. McCourt of Strong as a full and final settlement for her claim against the state for sheep and lambs killed by bear; said sum to be paid from the dog tax fund.

Chapter 163

RESOLVE, in Favor of Carrie M. Brawn, of Guilford.

Carrie M. Brawn; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,425.56 from the general fund of the state to be paid to Mrs. Carrie M. Brawn, of Guilford, to reimburse her for hospital, nursing and funeral expenses paid by her for her brother Guy Brown, of said Guilford.

Chapter 164

RESOLVE, Providing for the Payment of Certain Pauper Claims.
