Chapter 166

RESOLVE, in Favor of William Reardon, of Sullivan.

William Reardon; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$100 to be paid to William Reardon, of Sullivan, as a refund of the fee which he paid for a retail malt liquor license issued to him and which he did not use; said sum to be paid from the state liquor funds.

Chapter 167

RESOLVE, in favor of L. Archer Weymouth of Clinton.

L. Archer Weymouth; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,500 to be paid to L. Archer Weymouth, of Clinton to compensate him in full for loss of buildings and contents by fire kindled by Nelson Hendrickson and John Hobbs, state wards, said sum to be paid from the health and welfare appropriation.

Chapter 168

RESOLVE, in Favor of Irving I. Bates, of Moro.

Irving I. Bates; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$200 to be paid to Irving I. Bates, of Moro, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damage by bears to camp, equipment and supplies; said sum to be paid from the general fund of the state.

Chapter 169

RESOLVE, in Favor of Stacyville Plantation.

Stacyville plantation; appropriation for. Resolved: That the sum of \$1,718.87 be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of Stacyville plantation to reimburse the said plantation for money due it for the years 1924 through 1944, inclusive, under the provisions of subsection III of section

9 of chapter 173 of the public laws of 1921, as amended, said sum to be paid from the appropriation of the department of education.

Chapter 170

RESOLVE, in Favor of Nora B. West of Steuben.

Nora B. West; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general highway fund of the state, the sum of \$16.80 to be paid to Nora B. West, of Steuben, being a refund of 3c of the 4c state of Maine tax paid on gasoline used by her husband, William West, in his motor boat.

Chapter 171

RESOLVE, in Favor of Harold G. Wyman of Pittston.

Harold G. Wyman; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$31 to be paid to Harold G. Wyman, of Pittston, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for pullets killed by raccoon; said sum to be paid from the dog tax fund.

Chapter 172

RESOLVE, in Favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc., for Support and Maintenance of "Montpelier".

Knox Memorial Association, Inc.; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc., the sum of \$1,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1948, and the sum of \$1,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1949, to aid in the support and maintenance of "Montpelier", replica of the home of Major General Henry Knox, located at Thomaston, Maine.
